RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is concerned with the present trend of government funding, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe is also concerned about the extent and operation of the Bureau of Indian Affairs after the proposed reorganization, and
- WHEREAS, the National Tribal Chairmen Association is considered the most appropriate organization to represent the reservation Indian, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation desires their views be presented in the most appropriate places.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman, Fred Banashley, Sr., be permitted to join the National Tribal Chairmen Association and be recognized as a member of that organization for the interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and other Tribes of the United States.

The foregoing resolution was on April 5, 1973 dyly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
