RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Public Health Service construct a new hospital, and
- WHEREAS, the new hospital requested is to be constructed on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, U.S. Public Health Service determination indicates a minimum of a 70-bed hospital is justified, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires to provide the needed land of approximately sixty (60) acres for the use of this hospital facility.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby commits a required area of sixty (60) acres for the construction of the new hospital facility and other required structures.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED at the time of final site selection, the Tribe assures the U. S. Public Health Service, that the required sixty (60) acres will be available depending on approved engineering information.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for the final determination of the site location, the U. S. Public Health Service and the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Superintendent will all concur.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe will assume the present hospital facilities from the U.S. Public Health Service for use as a nursing home.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution No. 73-37 is hereby rescinded.

The foregoing resolution was on April 5, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
