RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Timber Company is in danger of being shut down due to a lack of sawlogs, and

WHEREAS, existing sales under contract are inoperative due to snow conditions, and

WHEREAS, Fort Apache Timber Company has requested a timber sale in the Middle Fork and West Fork of Cedar Creek, and

WHEREAS, the emergency nature of this request prevents a formal cruise of the area, and

WHEREAS, a logging unit contract and appraisal based upon a similar timber stand has been made, and

WHEREAS, the appraised stumpage rate for ponderosa pine is \$88.66/MBM, and the current 16% ratio (royalty) rate is approximately \$30.00/MBM.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Cedar Creek Logging Unit, as presented in the proposed contract subject to minor adjustments by the Approving Office be sold to Fort Apache Timber Company as described below:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman and Secretary of the Tribal Council are authorized to execute the contract and related documents necessary to administer the sale of timber for and on behalf of this council.

E IT FURTHER RESOLVED a deduction not to exceed twenty-five per cent (25%) of the gross receipts received from the purchaser will be accrued in the road suspense account. This accrual will continue until the road suspense account is funded to the extent required, to provide the road construction fund reserve authorized by the Tribe.

The foregoing resolution was on May 2, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
