

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Sunrise Complex Enterprise is attempting every way possible to be a success, and

WHEREAS, the operation of the Sunrise Hotel, Park Campground, Ski facility and proposed Service Station largely depend upon the Sunrise Lake fishing as an attraction to assist in monitoring on operating level, and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has about \$3,000,000.00 invested in the complex, and

WHEREAS, the present winter has been very serious and has caused a probable 100% fish kill in Sunrise Lake that will be detrimental to the entire complex, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that with the technical assistance from the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and the Bureau of Indian Affairs that proposed stocking schedules can be adjusted to immediately facilitate a desirable number of sizeable catchable fish to be planted in in Sunrise Lake.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Bureau of Sport Fisheries and the Bureau of Indian Affairs assist the Tribe in every way possible to adequately stock Sunrise Lake for quality fishing for this season.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Sunrise Lake not be closed as recommended by the Bureau of Sport Fisheries because the Tribe cannot stand the loss of income potential for the complex.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the Bureau of Sport Fisheries cannot supply an adequate number of catchable fish that the involved enterprise pool their financial resources and purchase wherever possible the required number and size of fish to maintain a quality fishing capability to attract to and supplement the income of the entire Sunrise Complex.

The foregoing resolution was on May 3, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
