

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe entered into a Memorandum of Agreement with the United States of America on July 7, 1971 regarding the provisions of sanitation facilities for the Home Improvement Project (Project No. PH 71-015 HIP) on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, The United States of America, acting through the Public Health Service, Department of Health, Education, and Welfare under the Provisions of Public Law 92-121 agreed that upon completion of the facilities to transfer to the White Mountain Apache Tribe all the facilities and their appurtenances provided for the benefit of the Tribe; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe agreed to accept the said facilities as the property of the Tribe for the Benefit of the Tribe so as to keep the facilities in an effective and operating condition; and

WHEREAS, the construction of the project is now complete; and

WHEREAS, the Transfer Agreement has been studied by the Council and the terms of it approved by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is hereby authorized to enter into this Agreement on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council

The foregoing resolution was on June 6, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1953 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1953, pursuant to Section 13 of the Act of June 10, 1934 (40 Stat. 904).
