

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION



WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is concerned with the Environmental Impact of its industries and reservation uses, and

WHEREAS, the tribe desires Air Pollution Control for the Fort Apache Timber Company, and

WHEREAS, this source of pollution has long been the concern of the tribe, state and the federal government, and

WHEREAS, the technology necessary to control this pollution has now been developed and it seems to be practical, and

WHEREAS, assistance in financing pollution control measures for all industries are more readily available.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman is authorized and directed to pursue this subject with various interested Federal Agencies for a source of funding and correction.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is authorized to sign any and all documents necessary to consummate the grant or other funding.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe considers this a major item of importance for the protection and enhancing of the Environmental Impact of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on July 11, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
