

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Law and Order Committee propose to the Council that a Policeman be hired to cover the Sunrise Complex for the protection of the properties located thereon and for the people using the improvements, and

WHEREAS, there is attached hereto marked, Exhibit A, a proposal to expend the sum of \$16,763.40 therein and for the necessary cost of furnishing said police protection, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that the Revenue Sharing Funds should be used to defray the cost of the said program.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chairman is hereby instructed and directed to negotiate and sign all necessary documents to consummate the appropriation in the sum of \$16,763.40 from Revenue Sharing Funds to defray the cost of furnishing the said police protection in the Sunrise Complex.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the implementation of a patrolman first class shall be effective the 26th day of July, 1973.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe proposed budget, Revenue Sharing Funds marked, Exhibit A, is hereby made a part of this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the supervision of this program shall be a part and partial of the Law and Order Program now on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on August 1, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 1 Abstd, 5 for and 4 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
