

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe enacted Ordinance No. 47 on January 13, 1963 establishing the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority in order to eliminate unsafe and unsanitary housing conditions on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority desires to provide decent, safe and sanitary housing for families of low-income on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and


WHEREAS, the Housing Authority works with numerous departments, and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, through IAM Release 57-24, has obligated to contract access roads to all units for Indian housing.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe request the Bureau of Indian Affairs Roads Department to provide access roads to Mutual-Help units, pursuant to IAM Release 57-24 attached hereto and made a part of this request.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).

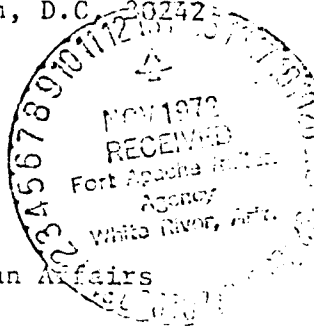



Subject: Bureau Policy on Providing Roads for Indian Housing  
Projects



This release transmits a new section 1.7 to 57 IAM which contains the Bureau's policy on providing the necessary streets and driveways for all Indian housing construction projects. Personnel in both the Division of Transportation and the Division of Housing Development should become familiar with this policy immediately to guarantee that funding of these projects will follow the policy which has been agreed upon by the Departments of Interior and Housing and Urban Development. Note the date on which this policy becomes effective.

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GENERAL

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- 1.7 Bureau Policy on Providing Roads for Indian Public Housing Projects. This section establishes the Bureau's policy on providing the necessary streets and driveways for Indian public housing construction projects.

All public housing clustered site projects started after July 1, 1972, by Indian Housing Authorities under an annual contributions contract with the Department of Housing and Urban Development should include within the cost of the Development Program money sufficient enough for the construction of paved streets and driveways within the project site.

However, paving for access roads to the project site will continue to be the responsibility of the Bureau of Indian Affairs. The project justifications for such access roads shall be submitted to the tribal body, which reviews all other reservation road needs, at least one year in advance of the need.

It is mandatory that all Bureau Divisions work in harmony to coordinate the planning of the housing projects with the local Indian housing authorities.
