

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Stanley Womer has served the Governor of Arizona in an outstanding manner, and

WHEREAS, as Federal Co-Chairman of the Four Corners Regional Commission, he ascertained from the Indian people on many reservations in the Southwest, their natural and human needs, and

WHEREAS, after ascertaining these needs, he efficiently secured a grant for the Indian tribes, and

WHEREAS, he has worked mostly with the Indian people and has learned of their needs and has further acquired a great ability to get the job done, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that he would be a great benefit to all the Indian people if he held a high position in the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council unanimously endorse the appointment of Stanley Womer as a Deputy Commissioner of Indian Affairs.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Assistant Secretary of Interior, William Rogers, be sent a copy of this resolution together with a wire endorsing the appointment of said Stanley Womer.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
