

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the houses formerly given to the White Mountain Apache Tribe by the U. S. Public Health Service, commonly known as picket houses are deterioriated, unsafe, unsanitary and a fire hazard, and

WHEREAS, the houses should be demolished.

BE IT RESOLVED that as soon as a vacancy occurs in any of the said picket houses, the Chairman is instructed to have that particular house or houses demolished.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and y-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
