

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 72-170, the Tribal Council decreed that there will be no more additional hunting and fishing privileges granted to non-members, and

WHEREAS, the Council is of the opinion that if in the future certain non-Indians, who marry White Mountain Apaches, should be granted hunting and fishing privileges on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and

WHEREAS, that the Tribal Council is of the further opinion that if the non-Indian divorces the White Mountain Apache, or if he or she leaves the reservation, the privileges should cease.

BE IT RESOLVED that if a non-Indian marries a member of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that he or she shall be granted an annual hunting and fishing privileges.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the said non-Indian shall receive an annual permit upon making application to the Board of Directors of the Recreation Enterprise.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the non-Indian, in any manner, does not treat with due respect, the game wardens, that this particular person shall have his permit suspended for such period of time as is decided upon by the Board of the Recreation Enterprise.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the non-Indian so desires he shall be entitled to a hearing regarding the suspension of his permit before the Board of Directors of the Recreation Enterprise.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the non-Indian divorces the White Mountain Apache or if he or she leaves the reservation, the hunting and fishing privileges will terminate upon the happening of either of these events.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the non-Indian must present to the Board of Directors of the Recreation Enterprise, proof of a legal marriage between him or her and the White Mountain Apache.

The foregoing resolution was on September 12, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 9 and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
