



RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, for the past seventeen years, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has invested a substantial percentage of its total income into recreation and tourism development, and
- WHEREAS, the said tourism industry has helped alleviate the Economic plight of the Apaches by creating many new jobs, and
- WHEREAS, for approximately seven years, the Tribal Council, in furtherance of its said goals, has attached the highest importance to the development of the Sunrise Ski-Motel Resort Complex, and
- WHEREAS, representatives of the Tribal Council, The Superintendent, Architect/Engineer, Tribal Attorney and Reservation Programs Officer met with the Economic Development Administration at Sunrise on the 10th day of September, 1973 in order to plead for the sum of Seven Million Dollars which the tribe deems necessary to complete the construction of the entire Sunrise Ski-Motel Resort Complex, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council unanimously was of the opinion that the complete and final construction of Phase III of the Sunrise Ski-Motel Resort Complex is of the highest priority and necessity to ensure the success of the recreational and tourism industry on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, the funding of Phase III shall again help alleviate the high and crippling unemployment that exists on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the completion of the Sunrise Ski-Motel Resort Complex has the highest economic priority of any economic endeavor of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Economic Development Administration is hereby requested to fund the sum of Seven Million Dollars as and for the necessary money to complete phase III of the said Sunrise Ski-Motel Resort Complex.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman is hereby authorized and directed to initiate and consummate any and all documents necessary to complete the funding of the said Seven Million Dollars of any part thereof.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman, at the advice and guidance of the Economic Development Specialist and the Bureau Programs Officer and the Sunrise Board, is delegated the power to establish Phase III priorities if the full sum of Seven Million Dollars is not realized.

The foregoing resolution was on September 12, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) and (j) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
