



RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is entering into an agreement with HUD for contract of 25 Mutual Help Houses, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe has been unable to receive firm bids on supplies and materials, and

WHEREAS, it is understood that the amount of money programmed for the project is \$901,633.00, and

WHEREAS, the inflation and increasing prices and lack of firm bids might not make it possible to construct the project for the approved amount.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires that the contract be entered into with full knowledge that prices of labor and materials might exceed the total planned cost of the project.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council gives its wholehearted and full support to the Construction Superintendent, Charles Patterson to do the best he can to complete the project for the amount of \$901,663.00 and if not possible to support the project with additional funds.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires that all possible housing be made available for their people for the betterment of the people and the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on September 25, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
