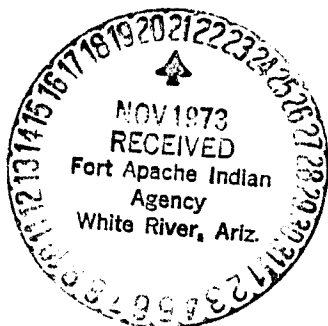


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise is in charge of camping on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, reservation traffic is growing at a faster rate with our limited facilities, controls must be installed and strictly enforced to keep our lakes and streams from facing extermination, and
- WHEREAS, this can only be accomplished by a planned program of new accommodations, better locations of campgrounds in connection with the Apache Enterprise retail outlets, and
- WHEREAS, plans include to relocate campground development at Horseshoe Lake to a two hundred campsite with plans to increase this to four hundred, and
- WHEREAS, the Recreation Board of Directors has authorized the Recreation Manager and the Assistant Manager to proceed with this program. Further to obtain help and guidelines from the Branch of Land Operations, North Fork Livestock Association, Department of Public Health and apply for a revolving credit loan to help finance this development, and
- WHEREAS, Recreation Enterprise has obtained permission from North Fork Livestock Association to move present campsite to a new location and also have obtained recommendations from U. S. Public Health Service on installation of new equipment.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe authorizes the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise to develop the campgrounds at Horseshoe Lake, in the most expeditious manner by use of Enterprise funds or other funds as becomes available.

The foregoing resolution was on November 7, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
