



Resolution No. 73-188

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the tribe had made application, through its Housing Authority, to construct twenty five (25) houses under Ariz. Project No. 16-18, and

WHEREAS, it is very probable that the Bureau of Indian Affairs will be required to construct the streets, curbs, gutters and sidewalks in the North Whiteriver Subdivision, and

WHEREAS, one of the greatest needs of the Apache people is that of housing.

BE IT RESOLVED that the road priority list is hereby amended to provide that the necessary funds to construct the streets, curbs, gutters and sidewalks in the North Whiteriver Subdivision, known as Ariz. Project No. 16-18, is hereby given the highest priority for roads on the reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superintendent is hereby requested to contact the Area Office and the Central Office, if necessary, so that funds can be provided for constructing the said streets to serve the twenty five (25) units to be constructed within the said subdivision.

The foregoing resolution was on November 27, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
