

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Superintendent was requested by the Tribal Council, at a previous meeting, to make a preliminary investigation to determine the possibility of establishing a new industry on the reservation wherein the cinder and gravel, limestone and other building materials located on the reservation could be utilized, and

WHEREAS, the Superintendent delegated this task to Mr. Cliff Anable, and

WHEREAS, Cliff Anable reported to the Tribal Council that he had made such a preliminary investigation and that it was very probable that an industry could be developed on the reservation which could employ as many as fifty Apaches and create additional income to the tribe in a sum between \$100,000.00 and \$200,000.00, and

WHEREAS, he requested the tribe to instruct him, if it was its desire, to continue the investigation and to make a final recommendation, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council was unanimously in favor of continuing the study.

BE IT RESOLVED that Cliff Anable is hereby directed to continue his feasibility study regarding the use of building materials on the reservation and developing a new industry thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that he report back to the council within two months of this date with his recommendations.

The foregoing resolution was on December 12, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
