RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, William Amos, Roads Engineer reported that he will be out of diesel fuel next week, and
- WHEREAS, he will have to give approximately 2,000 gallons of his stored diesel fuel to Theodore Roosevelt School so that the children attending school there can be kept warm, and
- WHEREAS, if he is not able to secure additional fuel, he will not be able to maintain the roads on the reservation and, if there is a severe snow storm here, it might prove disastrous if the roads cannot be kept open, and
- WHEREAS, if there is no fuel, some fifty Apaches will be laid off work adding to the already severe unemployment condition on the reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Chairman and the Tribal Attorney are hereby directed to use all available means to secure diesel fuel for the Branch of Roads of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on December 12, 1973 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
