

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the fencing of the Rock Creek Road was going to be done on contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs furnishing the supplies and materials, and

WHEREAS, due to the critical unemployment and the need to keep more families employed, it was the request of the Roads Committee to transfer this job to the Cibecue area to furnish employment through the CETA and Tribal Work Experience Programs.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the money established for contract of the Rock Creek fencing project be used for supplies and materials for a fencing project on the Cibecue highway.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Roads Committee and the Agency Roads Department meet with the necessary livestock boards and other people involved in the Cibecue Community for the location of the fence.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that due to the critical unemployment that the project be started as soon as possible and employ the number of laborers required to complete the project.

The foregoing resolution was on February 12, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe on June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
