WHEREAS, the Tribal Council thought this would be a good use of the premises, and


WHEREAS, the council requested that the American Legion Post No. 60 organize and develop and carry out youth programs for the benefit of the youths of the reservation, and


WHEREAS, the members of the American Legion Post No. 60 continue their fine work in the development and use of outstanding citizenship.

BE IT RESOLVED that the American Legion Post No. 60 have the responsibility of maintenance and upkeep of the tribal building and the surrounding area.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the American Legion Post No. 60 will continue their fine work in practicing and promoting good citizenship and organize and promote youth programs to benefit the youths of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on March 5, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
