
WHEREAS, the present Law Enforcement Administration has not consistently measured up to such high standards of professional conduct in law enforcement.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Chief of Police, Mr. Roy K. Douros aka Kenny Douros be and hereby is relieved of all duties, rights and responsibilities of said position, for such cause as is more specifically set forth in the attached letter, which by this reference is made a part hereof, and which is confirmed and supported by majority of the Council members voting and present this date.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Mr. Reno Johnson be and hereby is appointed to fill the vacancy created by this resolution and is therefore to be given all the duties, rights and responsibilities incumbent upon the position of Chief of Police.

The foregoing resolution was on April 17, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of, 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
