

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Southwest Forest Industries at McNary has requested permission of the Tribe to remove cinders from a designated area in the McNary Cinder Pit where sloping is needed, and

WHEREAS, the cinders will be used for townsite and mill purposes and royalties will be paid to the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Tribe requests that Southwest Forest Industries allow the Tribe to hookup sewer lines for new housing at McNary to Southwest's Sewage Disposal System.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Southwest Forest Industries is authorized to remove said cinders at the rate of thirty-five cents (35¢) per yard, payable to the Tribe, said authorization to continue until such time as the Tribal Council deems it necessary to stop the removal of the cinders.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said authorization is contingent upon Southwest's approval of the Tribe's request to allow sewer lines for new housing to be hooked up to Southwest's Sewage Disposal System.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman or Vice Chairman is hereby authorized to enter into said agreement with Southwest Forest Industries and to sign any and all documents necessary to execute this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on June 4, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
