

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need for family housing to be located at the Sunrise Recreation Complex to alleviate travel, family and employment problems resulting from the lack of such facilities, and

WHEREAS, the Farm and Home Administration has funds available for loans to construct such facilities under a loan to the Tribe, and

WHEREAS, the Sunrise Complex does not at the present time have funds available to undertake such a project.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is authorized to sign all documents necessary to secure a loan to build eight duplex two and three bedroom units at Sunrise with the Farm and Home Administration. Repayment of the principal and interest on such loan shall be paid through the rental of these units and such subsidies as may be available from Farm and Home Administration and any deficits shall be paid through the annual operating budget of the Sunrise Complex.

The foregoing resolution was on July 1, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
