

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

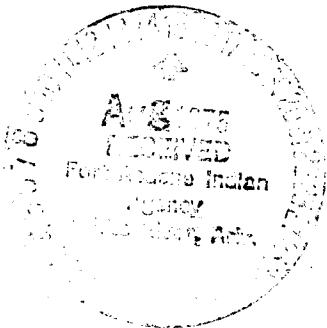
WHEREAS, the Southern Ute Tribe has entered as Amicus Curiae in United States vs. Akin which involve Indian Water Rights claims against the State of Colorado, and

WHEREAS, the main issue in the case involves the adjudication of Indian Water Rights and this issue potentially affects the interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of all Indian Tribes to cooperate in such an important manner as Indian Water Rights.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Southern Ute Tribe is hereby authorized to utilize the name of the White Mountain Apache Tribe in support of its position in United States vs. Akin.

The foregoing resolution was on August 7, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
