

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the U. S. Geological Survey has requested permission to install a stream-flow gaging station on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation located near the road crossing about two miles upstream from the confluence of Canyon Creek and Salt River, with this proposed installation consisting of two parts: (1) a small gage house (about 5' x 5' x 7' high) on the left bank of the stream with a pipe conduit (about 2" in diameter) extending along or under the ground from the gage house to the low point in the stream channel and; (2) a steel cable (about 1" in diameter) suspended across the creek above the high-water level, the gage house being located upstream from the road crossing and the cableway, equipped with a small cable car, located downstream from the road crossing, and

WHEREAS, the installation will not interfere with the flow of water in the stream and will provide information on water flow.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that permission be given to the U. S. Geological Survey to install and operate this gaging station with the understanding that the U. S. Geological Survey will move all or any part of the installation at their expense upon notification by the White Mountain Apache Tribe or the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency in the event that the road crossing is changed in location or a bridge or other structure built where there would be interference with the gaging station.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this will be on an annual renewable basis subject to revocation upon sixty (60) days' notice by either party.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this permit grants to the U. S. Geological Survey permission for ingress and egress to service, evaluate and maintain this recording station.

The foregoing resolution was on September 10, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
