

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Apache Tribal Guidance Center is severely handicapped in their operations due to the crowded conditions of the space available for them to occupy, and

WHEREAS, there are no other suitable facilities on the reservation available or funds with which to build suitable facilities, and


WHEREAS, an application has been made for a Federal Grant in the approximate amount of \$66,500.00 to build suitable facilities for the programs.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the application has the support of the Tribal Council on the condition that any grant money awarded shall be paid to the White Mountain Apache Tribe directly, for the use and on behalf of the Apache Tribal Guidance Center.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if favorable consideration is given to the grant that suitable land will be made available for use by the program to construct facilities under the grant.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman of the Tribal Council be and is hereby authorized and directed to approve any and all documents necessary to effectuate this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
