

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Indian village adjacent to McNary now has twenty (20) homes, and

WHEREAS, the need for domestic water supply is placing a burden upon the town-site of McNary, and

WHEREAS, it will be more desirable if this village had its own water supply, and

WHEREAS, in consultation with the Indian Health Service, there is a dire need for this water supply.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the U. S. Public Health Service plan to program a new well furnishing an adequate water supply to the McNary Mutual-Help village.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Chairman be authorized and directed to sign any and all documents to consummate this project.

The foregoing resolution was on December 3, 1975 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
