## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mr. John Garcia, Investigator for the Bureau of Indian Affairs, recently suffered a heart attack and consequently, is on sick leave and unable to perform his duties, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Police Department does not have sufficient personnel to cover the caseload handled by Mr. Garcia, and
- WHERFAS, the loss of Mr. Garcia's services represent a threat to the safety and welfare of all persons residing on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, and
- WHEREAS, it is not known when Mr. Garcia will be able to resume his duties and a temporary replacement is needed immediately to perform the duties of investigator until such time as Mr. Garcia can return to duty.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs immediately make the necessary arrangments to temporarily replace Mr. Garcia's position until such time as he can return to duty.

The foregoing resolution was on August 11, 1976 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
