## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council in 1974 established a Grazing Fee of six dollars (\$6.00) per head per year; and
- WHEREAS, due to the livestock hardship and poor market, the Grazing Fee for 1975 was reduced to the original fee of two dollars (\$2.00) per head; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has reviewed the happenings of the Livestock Industry and desire to establish the two dollars (\$2.00) fee for 1977 grazing year;
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Grazing Fee for the grazing year 1977 be established at two-dollars (\$2.00) per animal unit.

The foregoing resolution was on January 6, 1977, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
