## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Canyon Day Community has requested the Tribal Council's attention to the hazardous cliff running from Theodore Roosevelt Bridge north approximately one quarter of a mile along the Whiteriver Canyon; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is aware of and concerned about the dangers of said cliff to children and other persons walking near said area; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council deems it mandatory that a safety fence be constructed in order to reduce the hazards of said situation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it requests the assistance of the Bureau of Indian Affairs in providing and constructing a safety fence along the cliff above Whiteriver Canyon running from Theodore Roosevelt Bridge, north approximately one quarter of a mile.

The foregoing resolution was on January 6, 1977, duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
