RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the vehicle currently used by the Tribal Trapper has a broken frame near the front axle which presents a serious safety hazard, and

WHEREAS, this vehicle is used in extremely rough terrain which precludes safely plating the break, and

WHEREAS, the vehicle has in excess of thixty-three thousand (63,000) miles and should be traded in rather than transferred to another operation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the 1977-78 Central Tribal Budget include an amount not to exceed \$4,500.00 for the purpose of purchasing a new four-wheel drive vehicle for the use of the Tribal Trapper.

The foregoing resolution was on March 21, 1977 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
