RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is becoming increasingly aware of the need for orthodontic care for our children, and

WHEREAS, presently, the Whiteriver Indian Health Service Unit Dental Program is not able to adequately meet this growing need.

BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council, being concerned about this serious problem, request action of the Dental Services Branch, Phoenix Area Indian Health Service in securing sufficient contract funds, the services of an Indian Health Service orthodontic specialist, or other suitable means to satisfactorily meet this need.

The foregoing resolution was on April 6, 1977 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
