RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Police Department has been, for the past two years, updating their vehicle fleet with the assistance of various agencies including Law Enforcement Assistance Administration, and
- WHEREAS, there remains only three (3) vehicles which are dangerous to operate as emergency vehicles due to the excessive miles they have been driven, and
- WHEREAS, there are savings within various line items of the 1976-77 Fiscal Year Budget in excess of \$17,500.00, and
- WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Tribal Council that the Police Department be equipment with vehicles which, with safety, can be operated as emergency vehicles.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the 1976-77 Tribal Budget be amended to reflect the capital expenditure of \$17,170.81 to purchase a maximum of four (4) new vehicles with associated decreases within line items of the current Police Department Operating Budget and that the following vehicles be utilized for trade in purposes on the acquisition of the new vehicles.

The foregoing resolution was on April 6, 1977 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
