RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe now operates a supermarket offering a wide variety of groceries, meats, and other items, and
- WHEREAS, by utilizing this supermarket Tribal members aid themselves by procuring necessary daily items at the lowest prices in the area, and at the same time strengthening the economic position of the Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, through General Assistance grants provided eligible Tribal members by the Social Services Branch of the Bureau of Indian Affairs, means are made available for such members to purchase items at the store of their choice.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the White Mountain Apache Tribe request a Buy Indian Contract with the Bureau of Indian Affairs renewable annually, which will permit eligible recipients of General Assistance to designate the White Mountain Apache Supermarket as the store of their choice for purchases in the amounts to which they are entitled.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Buy Indian Authority be used by the Government Agency to purchase the product.

The foregoing resolution was on May 4, 1977 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
