RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Timber Company has created logging slash for burning, and other natural debri has accumulated in the forest and,
- WHEREAS, this unburned slash and debri constitutes a serious fire hazard and,
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Forestry Committee has reviewed the Bureau of Indian
 Affairs burning plan for this slash, and
- WHEREAS, there are provisions in this burning plan to restrict burning to one area at a time.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that BIA Branch of Forestry may conduct the 1977 burn as stated in the 1977 Prescribed Burning Plan.

The foregoing resolution was on July 6, 1977, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
