## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNIAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is the Governing Body of the Tribe, organized as a constitutional government under the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934, and under its Constitution and By-Laws, as approved by the Secretary of the Interior, has full power and authority to make and perform contracts and agreements of every description not inconsistent with law or the provisions of its Constitution, and
- WHEREAS, authorizing Construction and Installation of Devices for the measurement of Moisture, Precipitation and Weather Conditions on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is within said powers; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been formally requested by the Soil Conservation Service, United States Department of Agriculture, for permission to install a meteorological telemetry datea site consisting of a 4' x 4' x 8' instrument shelter, radio, 20' antenna and data sensors for snow, precipitation and temperature on a site located at the west end of Bonita Rock Cienega, Latitude 33 degrees 47' longitude 109 degrees 36', elevation 8270', for the purpose of obtaining hydrologic data; and
- WHEREAS, the facility will require no land space that is otherwise required by the Tribe, as it is minimal in ground area and will require only periodic readings and maintenance by a servicing technician; and
- WHEREAS, the facility will be entirely for governmental and public use purposes, with such data as collected at this and other similar sites being available to any person; Provided that its operations may be undertaken at any time by the Tribe, upon its request.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby grants permission to the Soil Conservation Service, United States Department of Agriculture, 3008 Federal Building, Phoenix, Arizona 85025, for placement of the facility above-described, and requested, on the Bonita Rock data Site, and that no charge or fee shall be assessed the United States for this privilege.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, however, that this resolution permits only the above described facilities and entrance and egress servicing of said facility, and implies no waivers or further consent of this Tribe, and that the operations of said facility, or any other similar facility on this Reservation, may be taken over by the Tribe, at any time, upon its request.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is authorized to sign and execute any agreements, easements or other documents required by the Bureau of Indian Affairs pertaining to this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that any prior Resolutions which are inconsistent herewith, in whole or in part, are hereby amended so as to be consistent herewith and said inconsistent parts are hereby superseded by this Resolution, or any parts hereof.

The foregoing resolution was on July 6, 1977, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
