## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is concern with the potential home fire on the reservation, and
- WHEREAS, over the past few years there has been many millions of new construction of homes, and
- WHEREAS, there is a great need for fire protection for the old and new homes.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Chairman be authorized and directed to apply to Housing and Urban Development for fully equipped modern Fire Station to protect the investment in new homes and human life.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Housing and Urban Development consider their request as a very high priority of the White Apache Tribe.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman be authorized to sign any and all documents to consumate their request.

The foregoing resolution was on July 12, 1977, duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (1) of the mended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934, (48 Stat. 984).
