FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Tribal Health, Welfare and Education Committee has recommended to the Tribe the John F. Kennedy Day School be expanded to include the Seventh and Eighth Grades, and

WHEREAS, represented in the Health, Education and Welfare Committee meeting were the citizens of the Cedar Creek Community and desire to expand the John F. Kennedy Day School to include the Seventh and Eighth Grades.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Bureau of Indian Affairs be requested to expand the John F. Kennedy Day School at the earliest possible time to include the Seventh and Eighth Grades.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that when this expansion is completed that an adequate fulltime ceiling allowance be assigned by the Assistant Secretary of the Interior, Forrest Gerard, to adequately staff the teaching facility and also construction of three more additions of government quarters, to include the Seventh and Eighth Grades.

The foregoing resolution was on March 1, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) & (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
