

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise has by ordinance and resolutions of the White Mountain Apache Tribe been entrusted with the responsibility for the control and management of the wildlife resources on the reservation for the benefit of the tribal members and the future generations, and
- WHEREAS, in order to provide this management, it has been necessary over the preceding years to gradually increase the personnel required to effectuate this management, and
- WHEREAS, the funds received by the Enterprise from sale of hunting and fishing permits does not cover the costs of the added personnel, and
- WHEREAS, the pressures from non-reservation people continue to grow on the reservation boundaries with regards to illegal hunting which, if not checked and controlled, could cut the wildlife population to the point that it could foreseeably be closed to hunting and even to tribal members, and
- WHEREAS, it will be necessary for the Enterprise to terminate the employment of some of the game wardens currently employed in control of the boundaries unless additional financial support is received.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Budget include the sum of \$50,880.00 as a grant to the White Mountain Recreation Enterprise to help defray the expense of the game wardens necessary to maintain the integrity of the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that after the evaluation of the Central Tribe's Budget, that the Superintendent will make the determination as to the availability of the requested \$50,880.00.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all additional sources of funding be explored and that an amendment to the current year Tribal Budget will be the last recourse.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if the determination is made that adequate funds are available through the Central Tribe, that the Superintendent is hereby authorized to request an amendment on the current year Tribal Budget in the amount of \$50,880.00.


The foregoing resolution was on May 31, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (k) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
