

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Raymond Endfield, Jr. made a comprehensive report on the Law and Order Planning Workbook II, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council felt well informed and appreciative of the information, and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council desires that the planning proceed with the utmost haste, and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Tribal Council to employ Michael J. Brown, P.C., Attorney at Law, as a tribal employee for the revision of the Law and Order Code.

BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Mr. Endfield's report on Workbook II be fully accepted.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman take the necessary steps to place Mr. Michael J. Brown, P.C. on the Tribal payroll to be an employee of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for the purpose of redrafting, consolidate and update the Tribal Law and Order Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this project be projected for an early completion between the Tribe, Mr. Endfield and Mr. Brown.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the starting and ending dates of Mr. Brown's employment be determined by Mr. Raymond Endfield, Jr. and the Tribal Chairman.

The foregoing resolution was on June 22, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section I (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
