

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised of proposed legislation in the United States Senate which would transfer the responsibilities of Indian Education from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to a new Department of Education; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council believes that no legislation opposing such proposed Bill has been introduced in the House of Representatives; and
- WHEREAS, it is necessary to have such opposing legislation introduced in the House, so as to present the destructive effects of such a proposed transfer.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby respectfully request that Arizona Congressman Morris K. Udall introduces legislation in the United States House of Representatives which would dis-allow any transfer of Indian Education responsibilities from the Bureau of Indian Affairs to a new Department of Education, or which would amend any proposed legislation to effectuate such a transfer.


The foregoing resolution was on July 13, 1978, duly adopted by a vote of nine (9) for and zero (0) against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) and (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
