

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has been granted federal funding through the Department of Health, Education and Welfare for the construction of an Indian Health Service Hospital at Whiteriver, Arizona, on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation;

WHEREAS, the construction of said hospital is in its very final stage; and

WHEREAS, during the course of hospital construction, at a cost to the Federal Government of over eleven million dollars, the Tribe has repeatedly requested that any federal funding must necessarily include funds for personnel positions and personnel housing, so that the services for which such construction is intended could be provided; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that funding has become available for personnel positions, but not for personnel housing; and


WHEREAS, the location of the hospital and the reservation mandate that housing must be made available in order to fill any anticipated personnel positions.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby respectfully reaffirms its requests on behalf of the people of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that federal funding be made available as soon as possible for the purpose of acquiring personnel housing for anticipated employees of the newly constructed Indian Health Service Hospital at Whiteriver, Arizona, on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council seeks the immediate attention and assistance of the Arizona Congressional Delegates in its efforts to obtain this funding and, therefore, to utilize the federally constructed Indian Health Service Hospital as intended.

The foregoing resolution was on July 13, 1978, duly adopted by a vote of nine (9) for and zero (0) against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
