

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council discussed the need for television reception in each community as a community betterment, and

WHEREAS, it was the desires of the Council that each community be explored for the possibility of being served by television boosters or retransmitters, and

WHEREAS, the desires of the Council is to benefit the standard of living for the young, middle age and old by having adequate television reception.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that an effort be made to explore the television reception possibilities for each community.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this project is of the utmost importance for family and community entertainment during the winter months.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the sources of funding be explored and that for the cost of development, if no other funds are available, the Chairman use Revenue Sharing money or Land Claims Recreation money that have not been programmed for this television project.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
