

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the forest resources of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation are of primary economic importance to the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and
- WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs, as a part of its responsibility in managing the natural resources of the reservation, has presented to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe an addendum to the Timber Management Plan which has been reviewed by the Council, and
- WHEREAS, the objectives of the plan for the Fort Apache Indian Reservation forest appear to be consistent with the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and its members and are in conformance with the Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, and the proposals for carrying out these objectives appear to be reasonable and sound.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the addendum to the Timber Management Plan of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation, Arizona, 1978, prepared by the Branch of Forestry, Fort Apache Indian Agency, be approved and submitted to the Area Director Phoenix Area Office to be approved, subject to review at any time by the Tribal Council with the right to make recommendations or modifications as is deemed necessary.

The foregoing resolution was on November 09, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
