



RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has discussed the unsatisfactory condition of the Cibecue Gymnasium, and
- WHEREAS, there are a number of faults, including but not limited to, the roof design or construction, floor design or finish and foundation weaknesses causing some settling, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council feels that these discrepancies are the fault of the contractor, and
- WHEREAS, responsibilities also lie with the architectural firm for inadequate inspection.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Apache Construction be held responsible for these listed discrepancies.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Council be presented with a punch list of unsatisfactory items by the architectural firm of Bovay Engineers of Albuquerque, New Mexico.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Engineering firm be held responsible for the final inspection and the acceptability of the total structure.

The foregoing resolution was on December 13, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
