



RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Public School District No. 20 Board of Directors has initiated Public Law 93-638 Contract for a construction of a new Public High School, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has shown strong support in the intense interest in getting this new high school, and
- WHEREAS, when money was made available, the School Board advertised for invitation of bid for the construction, and
- WHEREAS, the Oakland Construction Company was the low bidder and the Chuska Development Company, Inc. bid exceeded the low bid by approximately \$600,000.00, and
- WHEREAS, it is the desire of the School Board and the Tribal Council to award the contract to the apparent low bidder, the Oakland Construction Company.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Tribal Council strongly supports the School Board for Public School District No. 20 and request that the contract be awarded to the Oakland Construction Company.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED it's an extreme concern of the Tribal Council that government regulations and supposedly Indian preference is working an undue hardship upon the White Mountain Apache Tribe and the Public School District No. 20.

The foregoing resolution was on December 13, 1978 duly adopted by a vote of 10 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
