RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has identified alcohol abuse as its most important health care problem, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is committed to pursuing every possible avenue of assistance to effectively attack this problem, and
- WHEREAS, the U. S. Indian Health Service is now assuming responsibility for funding Indian alcohol programs, and has requested that the Tribe declare its intent to seek funding assistance to continue its alcohol control efforts.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council approves the attached P. L. 93-638 contract proposal for the development of a Tribally-sponsored non-medical detoxification program to be funded for the period of May 1, 1979 through January 31, 1980.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Tribal Chairman is hereby authorized to negotiate and execute all such documents as may be necessary to carry out the intentions of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on February 07, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of labstained, 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
