

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is aware that the Federal Government of the United States of America has mandated that scarce federal dollars be put to the best use possible, and
- WHEREAS, the Federal Government is allocating funds to the White Mountain Apache Head Start Program and applies certain criteria involving said funding, and
- WHEREAS, the Federal Government mandates increasing the quality of the Head Start experience for children by increasing the competence of the staff in the areas of child development and early childhood education, and
- WHEREAS, the Federal Government mandates that by October 1, 1981 any person who has been employed as a Head Start classroom staff member for three years or longer must be qualified.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby confirms that the White Mountain Apache Tribe will adhere to such requirements for the benefit of the Head Start children.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all presently employed White Mountain Apache Head Start classroom staff shall acquire the Child Development Associate (CDA) by October 1, 1981 and that any future employed classroom teaching staff shall receive Child Development Associate education within three years of the date of their employment.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Resolution No. 79-21 is rescinded.

The foregoing resolution was on March 13, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
