RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is aware that there has been a significant expansion in the housing and commercial development within the general area of the current Whiteriver city limits, and
- WHEREAS, there is a need to increase the area comprising the town of Whiteriver for such purposes as traffic control and fire protection, and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has reviewed the need for expanding the area currently recorded as the city limits of the town of Whiteriver.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the city limits of the town of Whiteriver shall include that area beginning at milepost 357 on State Highway 73 and extend easterly to the junction of Bureau of Indian Affairs roads R44 and R55, thence north to a point one quarter mile east of the north fork of the White River following the White River one quarter mile east in a northerly direction to a point due east of milepost 343, thence directly west across State Highway 73 to the base of the foothills, thence turning southerly and following the base of the foothills to a point directly west of milepost 357 and thence, turning directly east to the starting point.

The foregoing resolution was on March 14, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
