## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is advised that the Bureau of Indian Affairs Highway Safety Program is negotiating a Memorandum of Agreement with Indian Health Service Headquarters to provide for a First Responder Emergency Medical Services (EMS) system in Indian communities, and
- WHEREAS, this program would provide for the training and equipping of first responders with two-way radios and medical supply lists, and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has a great need for this program.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain
  Apache Tribe requests that Indian Health Service Headquarters include the White Mountain Apache Tribe in
  the development of a First Responder (EMS) Program in
  furtherance of the Emergency Medical Services component
  of the Highway Safety Act.

The foregoing resolution was on April 04, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
