RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Police Department has an urgent need for both basic and advanced training for its personnel, and
- WHEREAS, the Arizona State Justice Planning Agency (ASJPA) has available, limited Law Enforcement Assistance Administration block grant funds for use in training and upgrading Indian Law Enforcement Personnel.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council hereby approves a project for training of police personnel under the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration/Arizona State Justice Planning Agency block grant funding; and further, that the Tribal Chairman is hereby authorized to take all necessary actions to obtain funding for the said training project.

The foregoing resolution was on April 12, 1979 duly adopted by a vote of 6 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958 and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
